On the opening lead of the Queen of hearts, Elana studied the dummy for quite some time and, not wanting to pitch a spade or a diamond, eventually discarded the Ace of clubs as she won the trick in her hand with the King of hearts. She next cashed dummy's three top clubs and continued with a diamond from the dummy, ducked by East and won in her hand with the ten. She cashed her two remaining clubs (pitching spades from dummy), and continued with the jack of diamonds from her hand which held the trick. She now turned her attention to the spade suit, scored dummy's King of spades and exited with a spade to West's Ace. The heart return to her Ace gave Elana ten tricks on the hand and a five matchpoint score. There are other ways to come to ten tricks on this hand but clearly the pitching the Ace of clubs at trick one is the most spectacular. Well done, Elana.



Stay healthy & I'll see you at the bridge table.




Whistfully Yours by Bev Carter
