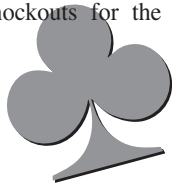

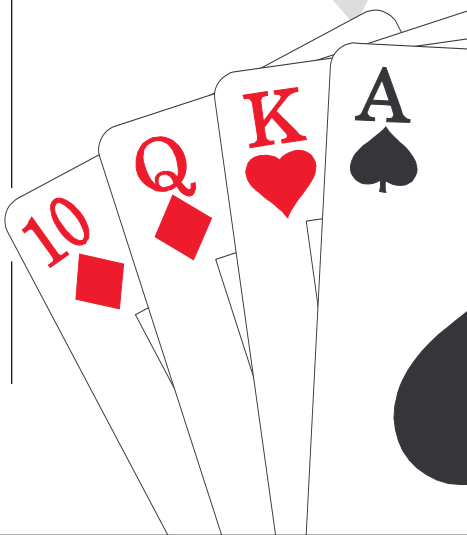

All the matches will be played at the Quirk Center in Cuyahoga Falls

Autumn Sectional – The Autumn Sectional will be held at the Tadmor Temple on October 5-6-7. For the KO team players, there will be the popular Three Session Bracketed Handicap KO Team event, with the first session at 7:00 p.m. on Friday and the final two sessions on Saturday.
