Do you aspire to gaze at the high, white star of truth in bridge? Or perhaps just want to feel like you know what you're doing at the bridge table every once in a while? It seems you're in the right place, because we're fortunate to have an ample supply of willing mentors and teachers in our Unit.

Classes for players at all levels are offered at the **Bridge Center of Buffalo** (834-4222). There are mentoring games every Tuesday morning and Thursday evening, each of which is preceded by a half-hour lesson. On Monday mornings, there is a 99er game, with hand records and analysis after the game. As of this writing in late December, classes are under way in basic declarer play and basic defense on Monday and Tuesday evenings, respectively. There are also beginner and intermediate sessions on Wednesday afternoons and Thursday mornings, with supervised play on Friday mornings.

The Amherst Bridge Club (836-7016) offers a program of "incubator groups" to its players, in which groups of four players at similar levels of ability participate together. This flexible program is tailored to the needs and desires of each group. Some of them focus on a particular topic in an organized lecture followed by pre-made boards. In other groups, the players write down the actual auctions and contracts during the course of a regularly scheduled game at the club, then gather afterwards in a class to analyze the bidding and play.

At the **Lockport Duplicate Club** (434-8635), the beginners' group starts with a short lecture, followed by a supervised play session using boards and travelers from a previous open game. The semi-monthly sessions typically take place on the second and fourth Thursdays of the month.

At **B & P Duplicate**, the motto is "Experience is not always the kindest of teachers, but it is surely the best."





I'd like to make the following nomination for best new convention. It's called the Lead Directing Hesitation. It is used primarily in no trump auctions but can be applied anytime you are certain your side is going to be on defense. Here's an example of how it works. The opponent on your left opens 1 NT and the opponent on your right makes a Stayman or transfer response. If you double, you are promising a strong holding in the suit bid artificially by the opponents. If, however, you hesitate noticeably before passing, you promise length in that suit but not enough strength to double for a lead. Now partner, with a holding such as Ax or OJ, knows that they can safely lead that suit. Proper application of this convention can cause deadly results for declarer. I know this from experience, having had this convention used against me on several occasions. Feel free to write in with your own nominations for best new conventions. Previous winners include Left-Handed Leads (promising a singleton) and Retroactive Doubles. Until next time. mibalex@aol.com.

Happy New Year! 2007 will be better. As you know, the Steelers did not make the playoffs, the Penquins may be looking for a new city in which to play, and the Pirates need our prayers, as well as the addition of some talent. We do hope a brighter future awaits us and that the pall over our wonderful city is history.

Sadly I must report the deaths of four very important members of our community: Betty Clay, Estelle Forstenzer, Nimi Somali, and Mary Lou Tracy. Betty was a long time player from Indiana, Pa. who was able to find a pleasant site for the Indiana game (Beacon Manor) when their previous playing area became too expensive. Betty was a wonderful partner and opponent who worked to make all players enjoy the game. She also enjoyed playing online. Estelle was a feisty little lady who really enjoyed the game. She was a Holocaust survivor who lost all of her family: parents, brothers and sisters in that horror. She left the concentration camp with the determination to make her life matter. She came to the United States, married and had two sons whom she educated successfully with her philosophy that they "they must use their talents to better our world." She taught this life approach to thousands of students in her many years of teaching in the Pittsburgh Public Schools. Although Estelle was 83 years old, she taught the week before the accident that killed her. Nimi was also an immigrant. Born in India, she became a medical doctor with a very successful practice here in Pittsburgh. Bridge became her avocation about 15 years ago and she became a Life Master very quickly. She played on a Knockout team with Bill Holt, Bob Park, and Bob Quinlan. This team enjoyed tremendous success until Nimi's health prevented her from playing. Nimi's bridge skills were considerable, but most of us will

remember her compassion and kindness. She helped so many of us enjoy life more. Mary Lou Tracy was a very energetic, enthusiastic, and fun loving lady who succeeded in enlivening every game she attended. She was a hard worker who helped to get Singles Bridge established. She also served as its treasurer. We mourn. Each of these ladies is greatly missed.

The STaC games this winter enriched the point totals of many Pittsburgh players. **Bernie Fudor, Susan Konig,** and **Ernie Retetagos** led District 5's list of winners. In fact, of the top 10 achievers, six are from our unit.
