

Other awardees include **Tom Lordi** who will receive the **Jane McIntire Award.** This is given to players in our unit who help others to enjoy the game. It is not based on titles, points, or service. The players who earn it exemplify the philosophy of Jane, who demanded that courtesy and consideration were not just desirable but essential for all bridge competition. Long before Zero Tolerance, she banned players from the games she directed if they did not exhibit proper behavior. She also set standards for the treatment of newcomers to the game. She welcomed them, introduced them, and monitored their progress. She often played with them and helped them become better(I was one of her fledglings and am greatly indebted to her and most grateful for this kindness). The first three recipients: **Sandy Schuchert** (2004), **Peggy Hoffman** (2005), and **Tom Lordi** (2006) exemplify Jane's ideals.

This is the tenth year the Milt Frazier Award will be given. It is the most prestigious Unit recognition. It is earned by the player whom the Selection Committee deems has done the most to create community in our Unit. It is most definitely a service award given to a player who has worked tirelessly for years to benefit the unit and also is an exemplary example of ethics and courtesy. These are the previous winners: Herb Wltoncroft-1997; Bob Beighel-1996; Mary Anne McNeirney – 1999; Jane McIntire – 2000 (deceased); Mary Frazier - 2001(deceased); Gus Costanso-2002; Ernie Retetagos-2003; Roni Atkins-2004; and Marcella Retetagos-2005. 


