## **Call the Director If**

- Negative comments are made concerning partner's or opponent's play or bidding.
- There's badgering, intimidation, rudeness, insinuations, profanity, threats or violence.
- There are constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.
- There is loud and disruptive arguing.
- There is annoying behavior or embarrassing remarks made.

Penalty: 1/4 of board's points.

Saturday A/X Pairs – 15.5 tables

From Carl Stone Spinach Spoon bread 1 stick butter, melted 1 package (10 oz) frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeeze dried 6 green onions, sliced (or chopped) 1 red bell pepper, seeded and diced 1 box (5 ½ oz) cornbread mix 4 eggs, lightly beaten 1 cup cottage cheese 1 ¼ teaspoons seasoned salt

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl, mix well.

Pour batter into oiled, preheated slow cooker. Cook, covered but with lid slightly ajar to allow excess moisture to escape, on HIGH 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> hours or on LOW 3 to 4 hours or until edges are golden and knife inserted in center of bread comes out clean.

Serve bread spooned from slow cooker, or loosen edges and bottom with knife and invert onto plate (I don't think this latter words well, if

Mr. Johnson: "Okay, but I didn't like the four letter word the doctor used


