# Interview Corner



The editor interviewed an energetic bridge player named **Linda Burroughsford**.

## Bridge:

- Linda started playing bridge in 2005
  when a golfing friend encouraged her
  to do something over the long golf-free
  winters. The women were all really
  good cooks and throughout the
  summer, their bridge teacher had
  several delicious barbeques and
  taught the women as well as their
  husbands.
- In October 2005 Peter Patterson and Linda were at a golf club's closing dinner seated with Claire and Irv **Gareleck.** Another couple asked what they did in the winter months and Linda told her she started to learn bridge. A connection was made with Claire and Claire invited her to play at the Bridge Center for lessons and mentoring. Much to their surprise the bridge she learned from her friend at the Bridge Centre was not the same her friend taught her. Claire Gareleck and Judi Fischer were patient and answered all questions regarding Duplicate Bridge. Peter and Linda earned their first master points in 2006 and they LOVE the game!
- She has many favorite players among them Chris Urbanek, Judy and Bob Padgug.
- Eugene Harvey's lessons on doubling and basic conventions were invaluable

- as well as **Christy Kellogg** hand analysis sessions after Monday's games.
- Her favourite bridge memory is from a tournament in Cleveland with **Eugene** Harvey in a knockout event. They were NV against V and after two passes Eugene opened 2H. RHO doubled. Linda raised to 3H with 7 HCP and 3 hearts. LHO passed. Eugene passed and RHO doubled. Linda passed, LHO bid 3S and her partner raised to game. When the doubler's hand went down, she had 28 HCP! As the hand played out, Linda realized Eugene had made his bid with 1 HCP and six of the worst hearts you ever saw. Their opponents made 6 but they prevented them from finding the slam that Linda and Eugene's partners found at the other table. They went on to win the knockout event and Linda got her first gold points.
- When the Director of the Fort Erie Duplicate Bridge Club (nonsanctioned) wanted to retire in 2006. she asked for a volunteer among the players to take over the game. She was told she had to buy the snacks, unlock the doors, make the coffee, set up the Mitchell (no matter how many tables!), collect the \$1.00 entry fee, do the manual scoring on the recap sheets and lock the doors after the game. When nobody volunteered, Linda did. One of the first things she did was purchase bidding boxes and she took a Director's course in December. The only calls she ever gets are for established revokes. They average approximately five tables throughout winter and about seven in summer. She's currently reading the Laws Book and the Bridge Director's Companion in preparation for her Director's exam. Good luck to you Linda!
- As for bridge goals, she hopes to become a life master sometime in 2009.

 Peter and Linda received formal permission from the ACBL to be a part of Unit 116 instead of their ACBLassigned home unit of 166 in Canada. Both consider Unit 116 their "home"

#### Personally:

- Linda met Peter in high school in Nova Scotia and have been married for 26 years and have a 16 year old son named Casey. Casey is interested in volleyball and basketball and Peter and Linda are able to attend his games. Linda is the oldest of eight children while Peter is the youngest of three.
- They both graduated from St. Mary's University in Halifax with Bachelors of Commerce and moved to Ottawa.
- Linda worked for the Revenue Canada on projects that include the computerization of Customs processes, data mining for Customs Intelligence, the introduction of the Free Trade Agreement and the introduction of the Goods and Services Tax.
- They moved to Fort Erie where they bought the McDonald's restaurants in 1998. Peter oversees the daily operations and Linda takes care of the books and deals with the Government. These are full-time jobs and allows them to create their own work schedules and be available to play bridge, golf and attend to their son's activities. She does her paperwork mostly between 8:00 pm and 2:00 am
- Both Peter and Linda are avid golfers. Linda started in 1998 and she shot her lowest round last season a 71, 1 under par. She had the honour of being named "Female Golfer of the Year" for the Niagara Region (Canada) in 2007. She plays on three women's amateur golf tours Western New York, Buffalo District and Niagara Region. She was "Club Champion" five years in a row while she was a member of Bridgewater Country Club and has just begun serving a two-year

- term as President of the Women's Golf Association of Western New York.
- When Linda finds spare time, she would love to resume her piano lessons, which she abandoned when she took up bridge.

## Bridge:

- Pat was introduced to bridge by her cousin Cathy Majewski, so she could fill-in for Cathy at her social bridge club.
- When Pat started playing bridge she received help from Mickey Lenzer and Sue Ganley.
- Her first partner was Bob Olin, who was kind enough to play with her. In her 35 years of playing bridge, she had many partners but her favorite was Dr. Vidi, Pat never knew whether you would win or lose but you always knew it would be an adventure.
- At present, Pat is a Unit 116 Director.
   For many years she was on the
   District V Board serving as Secretary,
   Vice President and President. Pat
   served as the Coordinator for
   Newcomer Events at the 2005
   Pittsburgh Nationals. Pat has worked
   very hard to promote bridge events in
   the past and will continue to do so in
   the future.
- Her goal for Unit 116 is to have more people involved in the Unit. People need to volunteer to help the Board with Unit Games and Sectionals. Nine people on the Board can't do everything. Pat also hopes that players would support Unit games regardless of where they are held. If they are held at an existing club, players should attend the game to support the Unit and not worry about where it is being held.

- Pat is married and has two sons and five grandchildren. Her oldest son, Jeffrey and his family live in Buffalo while her younger son, Michael and his family live in Michigan.
- Pat is a retired elementary school teacher.
- Since she has retired, she does a lot of traveling and enjoys spending time with her grandchildren.

**Betty Metz** reported the following on the cruise:

An absolutely beautiful ship (the Crown Princess), fantastic food, and bridge games run by our own Chris Urbanek. We enjoyed mini lessons and sanctioned bridge games. Participants had plenty of bridge mixed with the activities and entertainment provided by the ship. Old friendship were enjoyed and new friendships were made - this was a mighty nice group of people.

Regarding the recent bridge cruise presented by **Betty Metz** and **Chris Urbanek**, the editor heard the following:

- Chris had a lesson prior to the game
- There were approximately 5 tables.
- Bridge was played while the ship was moving.
- People who attended indicated they would attend another bridge cruise in the future.
- Only negative comment was that the ship did not announce the activity in their newsletter or public address system.

So, when Chris and Betty plan another cruise, be sure to sign up and have a good time.

## Agnes Gordon chosen for Bridge Hall of Fame

Gordon, one of ACBL's top players for three decades, has been chosen for the von Zedtwitz Award by the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame Committee. The award is given to a deceased person who has made outstanding contributions to the game as a player or in some other capacity. **Eric Murray**, who played with Gordon frequently, wrote in support of her Hall of Fame election, "There was no better female bridge player in North

America (including Helen Sobel) than Agnes and very few male players her equal. She achieved remarkable success frequently playing with mediocre partners." The two had a record 78% game in the final session of the Rockwell Mixed Pairs, which they won in 1963. Wrote Murray: "Agnes never came close to touching a wrong card or making a questionable bid. Everyone who played with Agnes marveled at her perfection. She unquestionably ranks with the all-time very best."

Gordon, who died in 1967, won seven North American championships, including the Chicago Board-a-Match Teams (now the Reisinger) in 1948; the Mixed Board-a-Match Teams in 1951, 1952 and 1962; the Women's Pairs in 1961; the Mixed Pairs and the Womens' Teams in 1967. She had numerous second-place finishes in NABC events and many regional wins. She was on the second-place squad in the World Women's Teams in 1964 and represented the U.S. in two world championships.

Born in Ontario, Canada, she moved to Buffalo NY but remained a Canadian citizen.

Gordon served on the ACBL Board of Directors representing District 2, was a member of the ACBL Goodwill Committee and president of Unit 116. She also taught bridge and ran a bridge club





"Yes we can!" by John Marvin

This hand came up in the Buffalo Bridge Center's Tuesday 299er game.



Let's say W decides to bid 6♣s and gets a ♦5 for an opening lead. She wins S's A and plays to the ♣A, roughs a ♠, plays low to the ♣Q, and roughs another ♠¹. She gives up a ♦², wins the club return (best) and cashes ♣s until reaching the 3 card ending:



The ♣A is the <u>squeeze card</u> and N is helpless. He must give up one of his guards and declarer discards accordingly from dummy

#### Footnotes:

- 1. The ♠ plays are for the purpose of shifting all of the guards into N's hand if possible.
- 2. To rectify the count.

- Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the top three District 5 partnerships in each event.
- The Olympiad Trophy will be awarded to the Unit with the most Olympiad points, which consist of:
  - a) Master points won by the medal winners and
  - b) Master points won by the top B and C pairs, but not a medal winner.

- You are not required to play with the same partner in each event. However, to qualify for Olympiad Awards and Olympiad Points in any event, both members of the partnership must be from the same Unit.
